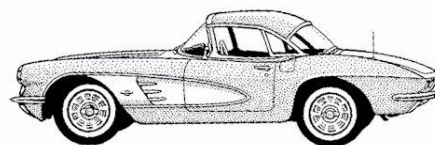

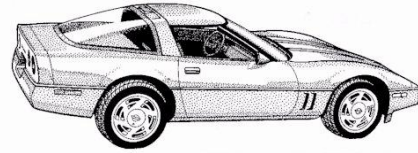

REFORMULATED GASOLINE

Definition: A gasoline blended to minimize undesirable exhaust and evaporative emissions from automotive engines.

Chemical composition: Gasoline, carbon 4 through Carbon 12 molecules.

Plus Oxygenate: one of the following-

Methanol	CH ₃ OH
Ethanol	C ₂ H ₅ OH
Isopropyl Alcohol	(CH ₃) ₂ CHOH
Tertiary Butyl Alcohol	(CH ₃) ₃ COH
Methyl Tertiary Butyl Alcohol	(CH ₃) ₃ COCH ₃
Tertiary Amyl Methyl Ether	(CH ₃) ₂ (C ₂ H ₅)COCH ₃

The Environmental Protection Agency ordered a reduction in the lead content of leaded gasoline in 1980 due to its toxic nature in exhaust. This reduction was to take effect on January 1, 1986. The lead content was reduced to 0.1 gram of lead per gallon. Much less than the 3.0 to 4.0 grams per gallon used during the 50s and 60s.

Reformulated gasoline was first introduced by ARCO in 1989 and marketed as an "Emission Control" gasoline in Southern California. It was intended as a fuel for vehicles not equipped with catalytic converters. "EC-1" gasoline was unleaded, although it was designed to replace leaded gasoline, and carried the same octane as the fuel it replaced.

The reduction of emissions was achieved several different ways:

- ⇒ Reduced vapor pressure, which minimized evaporative emissions.
- ⇒ Lower aromatics and olefins to reduce smog forming hydrocarbons and benzene emissions.
- ⇒ Low Benzene content
- ⇒ Use of oxygenates to improve CO and HC exhaust emissions.
- ⇒ Reduced sulfur content.

Tests performed by ARCO on the new EC-1 gasoline indicated statistically significant reductions in regulated and other emissions.

	Approx. Reduction
Exhaust hydrocarbons	5%
Evaporative emissions	22%
Carbon Monoxide	10%
Nox	6%
Exhaust benzene emissions	43%

Soon after Arco introduced EC-1, many other U.S. companies followed suit with their own versions of reformulated gasoline. The reformulated gasoline was mostly marketed only in restricted areas of the U.S. and with many variations between the specifications that each company imposed on itself.

Federal and State of California Regulations came into effect, starting in 1995, which carefully control and regulate the properties and composition of reformulated gasoline. This includes the use of oxygenates.

Reformulated gasoline was required in nine major areas in the country where smog and ozone problems existed. These areas are Baltimore, Chicago, Hartford, Houston, Los Angeles, Milwaukee, New York, Philadelphia, and San Diego. Other areas in the country with ozone problems can also require reformulated gasoline.

The Clean Air Act Amendments of 1990 prohibited the sale of leaded gasoline for use in motor vehicles effective January 1, 1996. California prohibited the sale of leaded gasoline effective January 1, 1992.

Emission standards were tightened again in 1997 and in effect through 1999. On July 1, 2000 the restrictions became even tighter on VOC emissions. The "Code of Federal Regulations" subtitle 40CFR80, subpart D, gives detail of the standard and tests for certification as reformulated gasoline.

Cars built in 1970 and prior were designed to run on leaded fuels only, however many run fine on the new unleaded fuels. The valves and valve seats on these engines were designed to operate with a coating from the leaded fuel that prevented burning valves and seats. If one of these engines were subjected to high speed sustained load operation, the valve seats should be replaced with the new hardened alloy steel seats to prevent this malady.

Cars built from 1971 through 1974 were designed to run on both leaded and unleaded fuels. Most 1975 and newer cars are equipped with catalytic converters and require unleaded fuels to prevent poisoning of the catalytic converters from lead compounds in the exhaust.

The performance of the new Reformulated Gasoline is comparable to that of previous fuels with only a little difference in odor and color. The energy content is 2 to 3 percent less than previous and may show a slight decrease in fuel economy depending on the way a person drives.

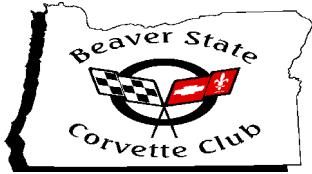
